



GIFT TO THE PRESIDENT.

Empress Dowager, of China, Has Sent Her Photograph.

The Secretary of State has received through United States Minister Conger, at Peking, for presentation to President Roosevelt, a large photograph of the Empress Dowager of China. At the celebration of the anniversary of the Dowager's birthday in Peking last November Minister Conger was received in special audience at the palace to present to her President Roosevelt's letter of congratulation.

The plcture gives her the appearance of forty years instead of seventy. It is contained in a large gilt frame and rests in a black wood box, with a yellow silk curtain hanging over the front of the plcture. The box is inclosed in a well-fitting, yellow-quilted silk case, and over all is spread an exquisitely embroidered cloth of imperial yellow. The photograph will be delivered to the President at once. The Empress also presented a small likeness of herself to Minister Conger.


















